The Alpha Delta local fraternity chapter at General Motors Institute, Flint, Michigan, is petitioning for affiliation with Phi Delta Theta. If its petition is favorably acted upon at the next national convention, the GMI group would become the third active Phi Delt chapter in the state.

The membership of Alpha Delta, housed in a new chapter house on Dupont Street in Flint, is composed of undergraduate and graduate students at General Motors Institute. GMI is a degree-granting engineering school accredited by the North Central Association. The institute was founded by General Motors in 1919 and has a current entollment of approximately 2,400.

Appropriate reviewing groups representing Phi Delta Theta National Headquarters have visited or will be visiting the Alpha Delta chapter at Flint. The senior advisor to the fraternity at the present time is Brother Gerald H. Cummings, (Mich. Alpha, 1938-1940 and Mich. Beta, 1941). Brother Cummings is a GMI faculty member, on the social studies staff.

This letter, written in behalf of the members of the Detroit Alumni Club of Phi Delta Theta, heartily recommends favorable action on the petition of the Alpha Delta chapter in Flint, Michigan, assuming that the findings of the national reviewing committee are also favorable.
